Message from the CEO

When my father was battling pancreatic cancer, he suffered through chemotherapy, radiation and surgery before being told there was no hope. By that time, his weight of 89 pounds on a 6'2" frame made him resemble a skeleton of his former self. He

had endured unimaginable indignities, losing control of his bowel functions being the most humiliating for him. He was in terrible physical and mental pain, and he was only surviving by being fed through a tube inserted into his stomach. Still he lived several more weeks. The last few days, he was in a morphine-induced sleep. A nurse accidentally roused him at the end, and I witnessed the "throes of death." With his eyes opened wide in panic, he was screaming and writhing in pain. It's a memory that haunts me still, almost 25 years later. At the time, I couldn't help thinking that we treat animals more humanely by offering euthanasia, which literally means "easy death."

Few topics engender more heated debate in animal welfare than the subject of ending life. Some people believe that sustaining life is the most important goal, while others believe that there are fates worse than death. Whatever one's conviction is, I imagine it is arrived at through as personal a reason as mine.

I often say that in animal welfare, we all want what is best for animals...we just sometimes disagree about what is best.

One of the questions I am most often asked is, "Are you a 'no kill' shelter?" I try to use the question as an opportunity for education. All shelters...even those that are "no kill"...euthanize animals when there is no hope for recovery.

Shelters may differ on what constitutes "no hope." It can be a very difficult judgment call, and one that we do not take lightly. At the VBSPCA, we have a committee of eight professionals, including a veterinarian, that makes these decisions. No one takes these decisions more seriously than the professionals who must actually perform the euthanasias.

For our shelter, when there is no hope for what we would consider a good quality of life, we believe euthanasia is the most humane option. Others might disagree. As one example, we do not believe that keeping extremely aggressive animals that are not safe to live in the community alive in kennels indefinitely. For many dogs, it leads to mental deterioration, a condition we refer to as "cage crazy."

A live release rate of 90% or more of the animals who enter a shelter is the current benchmark for a "no-kill" shelter. Of course the rate a shelter is able to achieve depends in large part on the animals that are accepted into the shelter. So comparing shelters based solely on euthanasia or live release rates, without taking into consideration shelters' intake policies, can be very misleading.

For example, at the VBSPCA, most of the animals we take in are "owner surrendered" or transferred from other shelters. We do not generally accept stray adult dogs and cats. Instead, we direct strays to the public shelter where they must be kept on "stray hold" for a period of days to hopefully be reunited with their owners.

On the other hand, we have an agreement and partnership with the public shelter in Virginia Beach to take any unweaned puppies and kittens taken into their custody any time of day or night. We have volunteers who bottle feed and care for these babies until they are old enough for adoption. Many of the kittens are so sick by the time they come to us that they are not able to survive. This tends to make our feline euthanasia rate higher than shelters that do not accept unweaned kittens.

These are just a few examples of how intake policies affect outcomes.

At the VBSPCA, we make decisions based on each individual animal, rather than a goal to achieve a certain rate. We try to help as many animals as possible, while ensuring that each of these animals has quality of life and a life worth living. Our live release rate consistently hovers around 90%, which would technically meet the definition of "no kill," but we do not use the term. And we never "kill." Instead we offer suffering animals merciful deaths. Something my father didn't have as an option.

We are so grateful for your support in furthering our mission to create a more humane and responsible community by eliminating animal suffering while increasing human compassion.

Partnerships

HSUS - Sister Shelter

In an effort to assist overwhelmed animal shelters of Puerto Rico, The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and Maddie's Fund® established the Sister Shelter Project to pair Puerto Rican shelters with thriving shelters in stateside U.S. The VBSPCA, a long-time HSUS Emergency Placement Partner, was selected to be part of this project.

Lacy Kuller, VBSPCA Vice President & CFO, and Jenny Teed, Director of Shelter Operations, traveled to Vieques Humane Society on the island of Vieques in February to provide mentorship, support, and hands-on problem solving and skill sharing. In April, HSUS flew Aleida Tolento and Sheila Burgos, of the Vieques Humane Society, to Virginia Beach to visit the VBSPCA shelter for a day.

In preparation for the visit, the Virginia Beach SPCA staff put together enrichment projects and operating procedures to help Vieques Humane Society further their mission of saving lives. During their time here, they visited College Park Elementary School to see the VBSPCA Humane Education program in action, followed by a tour of the VBSPCA main shelter on Holland Road. After lunch, the group headed over to Virginia Beach Animal Care and Adoption Center for a tour and finished out the day at the Virginia Beach SPCA Pet Supplies & Adoption Center.

This is the first time a program like the Sister Shelter Project will be carried out on this scale. It will set a precedent where rural and underserved communities in Puerto Rico and Stateside United States have resources and support from strong, knowledgeable animal shelters and animal welfare professionals. The Virginia Beach SPCA is honored to be part of this pilot program.







At the beginning of this year PETA fieldworkers found Pearl and Doc in rural Virginia in a county that has few animal services. Both dogs were kept outside 24/7. Pearl and Doc's former guardian owned 10 dogs and he genuinely felt guilty about having to keep the dogs penned outside. He relinquished Pearl and Doc to PETA and is accepting assistance to spay & neuter his remaining dogs.

Through the VBSPCA Pearl and Doc found a loving home together! Since 2004 VBSPCA has taken in 1,347 animals from PETA, many of which have medical needs. PETA provides the funding for these treatments to give the animals the best possible chance of finding a forever home.

We also partner throughout the year for adoption events where together, along with other local shelters, we encourage responsible pet ownership and bring public awareness to the programs offered throughout Hampton Roads.

Tim's Tips for Training a Reliable Recall

One of the most important cues to teach any dog is "Come". However, a reliable recall proves to be one of the more difficult aspects of obedience training.

The 4 rules of recall

- 1. Never call your dog for anything unpleasant. Such as nail clipping, bathing, or having his leash clipped on to go home from the park. In short, anything that might make him pause the next time you call him.
- 2. Never call your dog if you are not sure he will come. All recalls should be successful recalls. Work at your dog's level: If he has a kindergarten-level recall, don't give him a graduate assignment like being called away from a cat in a tree.
- 3. If you call your dog and he doesn't come, you must make it happen. Run over to him and put a treat in front of his nose, backing up as you get his attention so he follows you. Resist the urge to call over and over. It only teaches your dog to tune out the command. Call once, then make the recall happen.
- 4. If you want your dog to stop whatever interesting doggie thing he is doing and come running to you, make it worth his while. Use extra yummy treats - no dry biscuits here! Or a well-thrown ball, if that is your dog's fancy.

When to help:

• It is not normal for a baby to be sitting in the same spot for more than 15 minutes and may mean it is in trouble. Even fledglings (birds that are fully feathered, and look like small adults, but can't fly yet) should be very active, hop-flying through the yard. Although the parents may be present and feeding the baby, it still may be injured and in need of rescue. However, you must be careful not to remove babies from the wild unless you know they need help and are not just healthy youngsters learning to navigate on their own. Watch carefully to monitor if it is moving around or if there are

Any baby animal that is not fully covered with feathers or fur, or has pink skin showing through, should not be out of its nest and needs to

be rescued. Never leave a sick or injured animal exposed in the yard.

Get him inside to safety and get help.

• If there are predators present, or other immediate dangers such as children who may cause harm, you need to help the animal. Predators include cats, dogs, crows, bluejays, or other omnivorous birds that are attempting to cause harm. First try to remove the predator. Baby wildlife always do best with their parents.

• Animals who have visible blood or other obvious signs of trauma needs to be rescued quickly. The presence of flies or fly eggs means there may be blood or infection.

Wildlife Rehabilitation



Our wildlife team helped rescue a Bald Eagle in March.
Dr. Diana Sandstrom, lead wildlife vet, and Barbara Gipson, Wildlife Director, triaged and stabilized the wing, so it could be transported to the Wildlife Center of Virginia.





If rescue is needed:

• You can use a shoe box for holding and transporting most wildlife. To pick up an animal you can, gently drop a cloth over the animal and scoop it up.

• Babies cannot retain body heat: Place a hand-towel or t-shirt in the dryer for a few minutes to get warm then place it under and around the baby.

• Keep the animal away from humans and other animals. Be sure to **never** give food or water, this could harm the animal. Get help ASAP.

Become a Foster

What is involved?

Supplies: We provide food, litter, bedding, toys, and other related supplies for your foster animals. We also provide counsel and medical care, when necessary.

Confinement: Keep your fosters inside and separate from your pets to protect both sets of animals. Don't feel bad about confining your fosters to your extra bathroom or bedroom – that is more space than they would have growing up in our shelter. Plus, it is also easier to litter box/potty train in a smaller space.

Time: Your commitment can be as little as one week; in some cases up to 10 weeks for the tiniest of kittens. With puppies and kittens you need to be prepared to bring them to the shelter once a week to weigh-in and undergo a wellness check and any pertinent vaccinations.

Emotional bond: When you have nurtured an animal for a period of time in your home, you will naturally form a bond with it. Please be aware that returning your fosters for adoption can be emotionally difficult for you and especially for children. Be sure to talk with your family members about the reasons for fostering and how your time with the animal will conclude. Sometimes foster parents end up adopting a foster animal, but please be aware that regular adoption procedures apply. Adoptions can only be facilitated by shelter staff.
