OUTDOOR PRODUCTS AND PLANTS

The most common poisonous plants for the Hampton Roads area are **yew, azalea, and lilies.** Also when exploring a new park or trail, always monitor your dog closely. **Pesticides, fertilizers, and insecticides** could be fatal, so always make sure they are dried completely before letting your dog roam in the area.



HOUSEHOLD AND FOOD PRODUCTS

Common household items can be fatal to pets, including chocolate, grapes, garlic, onions, coffee grounds, alcoholic drinks, homemade play dough, fabric softener sheets, and detergent. Automotive products and cleaners, such as Windex or antifreeze, can also cause side effects ranging from a stomach ache to death.



MEDICATIONS

Certain **flea preventatives** can cause bad side effects. Medications should always be prescribed by a veterinarian, and keep in mind that animals can overdose on medications just like humans. A **pet medication** meant for a dog should not be given to a cat or a rabbit. Keep all **human medications** stored in a secure place.
