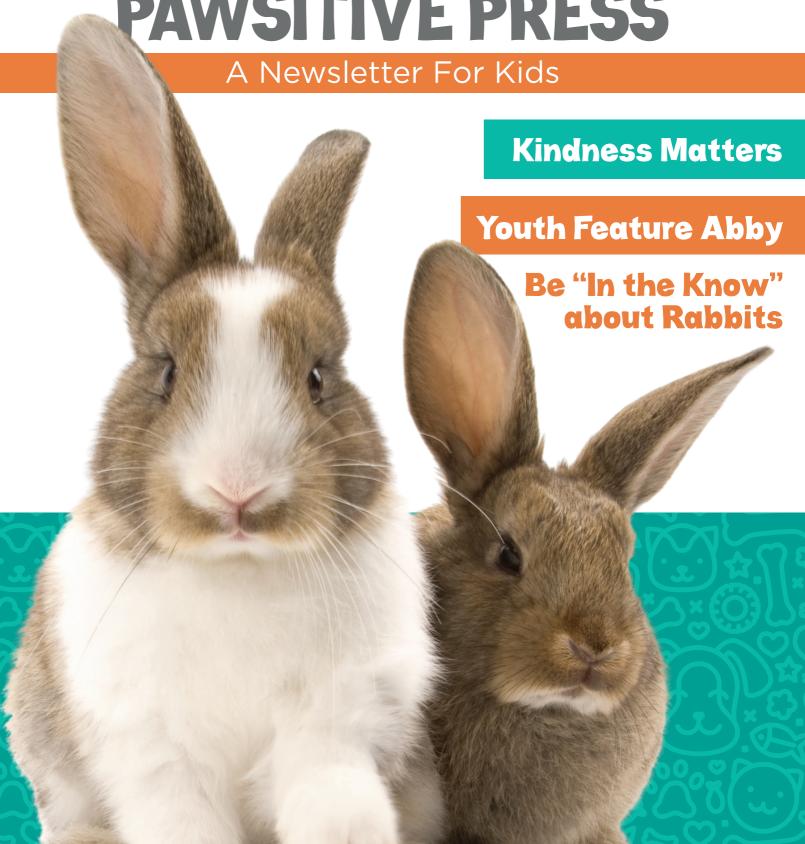

Did you know that the Virginia Beach SPCA shelters and cares for rabbits? Just like cats and dogs, we help rabbits find their forever homes. We also help other small animals find forever homes, including guinea pigs, hamsters, rats, mice, and birds.

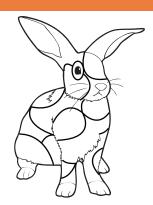
It is important to know that not all rabbits want to live with people. WILD rabbits know how to find food and avoid predators and should NOT become pets. The most common type of wild rabbit in the US is the eastern cottontail. Cottontails always have short brown fur, so they are easy to recognize. DOMESTIC rabbits, or pet rabbits, have been raised to depend on humans, so it is not safe for them to live in the wild and we should **NEVER** let a pet rabbit loose in the wild. Domestic rabbits can have lots of different colors and patterns in their fur.

Here are some other facts about rabbits:

- Rabbits live to be 8-12 years old.
- A baby rabbit is called a bunny.
- Rabbits are herbivores, which means they only eat plants. They should eat a variety of fruits and vegetables. You may think that rabbits mainly eat carrots, but it's actually not good for them to have them every day!
- Rabbits like to keep themselves and their environment very clean. You can even teach a bunny to use a litterbox just like a cat!
- A rabbit's teeth never stop growing! Luckily their teeth stay short from normal wear and tear.



Fun Fact: When rabbits are happy, they do something called a "binky" – that's when they jump and twist in the air!
