IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR 2020 TAX FILING

- Taxpayers who do not itemize their deductions can take a one-time deduction of up to \$300 for gifts made to charitable organizations. The deduction is ONLY for gifts of cash made in calendar year 2020. For taxpayers who are married filing jointly, they may take a one-time deduction of up to \$600 for cash gifts made to qualifying organizations in the calendar year 2021.
- In a typical year, individuals can only take a charitable deduction of up to 60 percent of their adjusted gross income, no matter how much they give. For 2020, there is no limit. Cash contributions are fully deductible.
- In 2020, corporations may deduct 25% of charitable gifts as opposed to 10% in a typical year.

The great news is that it is 2021 and we are still here, working hard for the animals and connecting them with their best lives yet. While there are days that seem endless and exhausting, there are even more days that are timeless and joyful.

Throughout this fall and the first half of our fiscal year, those are the moments that we hang onto- that help us wake up and face the day with new bravado and even more importantly, hope.

As we began our fiscal year in September, we started off strong with our 365 Days of Compassion fundraiser. We had so many folks celebrate the special days in their lives and it was a true symbol of our generous and dedicated community. We also planned our fall festivities, Mutt Masquerade and Puttin' for Paws, with great hope for in-person events. As we all know, events happened virtual or not at all, and the fatigue of virtual attendance dashed our hopes of significant participation. But we continue to persist in delivering our mission in so many other ways. 2020 did not define us, but it does continue to mold us.

The holidays brought different ways for us to celebrate and share our hope. Our community of supporters rallied strong on Giving Tuesday, raising almost \$40,000 for our Miracle Medical Fund. Outdoor Lighting Perspectives helped us decorate the shelter with the splendor of holiday lights, allowing us to feel festive every night. And once again, Toyota and Priority Automotive helped us send 130 animals Home for the Holidays, through their funding of adoption fees. Joy was everywhere this season at the VBSPCA.

As we round the corner on the New Year, refreshed hope abounds. Through the generosity of the Alfred L. Nicholson Fund of the Hampton Roads Community Foundation, we have new lighting in our parking lot, creating a safer environment for staff and public guests. Through this grant, we have also updated our technology, ensuring the security of our data and greater efficiency for all of our operations. And in keeping with our own value of community, we hosted a food drive for the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia on the National Day of Service. We had a huge response from our staff, friends, and neighbors throughout the community and joyfully delivered our gift to those in need. We continue to focus our leadership, not only on our mission of strengthening the animal-human bond, but also on the bonds that tie us together as humans. That focus will be threaded throughout all of our work this year, as we look to our workforce and our mission to be one of inclusion. One of these initiatives is our Humane Education program as we work

to develop virtual programming that can be accessible to all children in our community. Our youngest animal lovers are a critical audience- we need to keep them engaged and active in understanding our mission of compassion. Our current fundraising appeal is our Humane Education Match – we still have \$5,000 in matching funds left. Your gift will help us create those connections and reach more young minds and hearts.

Time marches on. The pandemic is still here- but help is on the way. We will continue to be open to serve the community and their animals, following all the guidelines for our safety and our health. So yes, we have been here before, but we have never been stronger or more resolute in our commitment to our community and our animals. Q: How did you first get involved with the VBSPCA?

Kate grew up in Virginia Beach and has been a lifelong animal lover, so it was a natural fit for us. Here we are 5 years later... Q: What area of the organization inspires you the most?

Working Together To End Homelessness

Roxy and her litter of newborn puppies were surrendered by a backyard breeder whose home environment had become uninhabitable. They were originally surrendered to our friends at Tri-County Animal Shelter who then transferred the mother and pups to the VBSPCA. One of our dedicated foster families took in the mother and her entire litter for 7 weeks until the puppies were old enough and healthy enough for adoption. As of February 4th, all of the puppies have been adopted, and Roxy is ready and waiting for her forever family to arrive. This mom has been through quite a journey, and we know her next chapter will be her best one yet.



On August 4, 2020, a tornado destroyed a mobile home park in Bertie County, North Carolina. Champ was out in the yard and tethered to his dog house when the storm came through. The next day, he was found in a nearby ditch with the dog house still chained to his body. It took the teamwork of three organizations to save Champ's life and give him the second chance he needed. He had been visited by PETA prior to the tornado, with their team providing him food, water, and basic necessities. After the storm, Bertie County Humane Society took him into their care for safekeeping. Week's passed and Champ's owners never claimed him. He was then transferred to the VBSPCA where he had a better chance at finding a family. On January 31st, Champ was adopted into a loving home.

Roxy and Champ are two of the many success stories we are able to tell with the help of our transfer partners. These partnerships move animals out of areas where adoption is unlikely and into shelters like the VBSPCA where our community is dedicated to supporting adoption. VBSPCA transfer partnerships made second chances possible for 1,373 animals in 2020. While we all work individually to make a difference in the lives of homeless pets in our specific communities, together we can do so much more.

Despite her rough start to life, this 4 year old was immediately friendly to our clinic staff as they worked to determine the source of her allergies and discomfort. With the help of steroids, antibiotics, anti-anxiety medication, and a special diet, Poppy's skin is finally healing and her hair has begun to grow back. This sweet girl loves belly rubs, is extremely generous with her kisses, and is ready for her forever family to show up and take her home.

Thor, a senior Saint Bernard mix, arrived at the shelter in early December. His fur was extremely matted in knots all over his body and he had a severe ear infection - both of which were causing a great deal of pain. Thanks to the Miracle Medical Fund, Thor has made a complete recovery and was happily adopted into his forever home on January 29th.

Innovation

Humane Education

Humane Education is a pillar of the VBSPCA mission, and the new normal has forced many changes to our long standing programs. With limits on in-person and group experiences, efforts have been put toward engaging children in their homes. From writing competitions to art challenges, we have continued to share and encourage the values of respect, empathy, and kindness in hopes of creating a more compassionate community.

Last fall, we invited children to participate in a 3-part reading challenge. Reading assignments included books about kindness, books about animals, and even reading in the presence of a pet. Some children participated on their own and some as part of a class assignment, and we even had 9 year old Abby participate all the way from Pennsylvania.

During the month of December, we provided children with



the opportunity to send Holiday Wishes to our shelter animals. A variety of letter templates were made available on our website, and we had children from all across Hampton Roads mail some very special wishes to our animals.

Our Pawsitive Press just wrapped up its first official year in publication! This seasonal youth newsletter includes educational lessons and activities designed to instill character values while reinforcing the VBSPCA mission. Past publications have focused on wildlife, black cats, the dangers of heat, and our Winter 2021 issue is all about rabbits.

A Tale for Two launched last July and we have welcomed over 175 children into the shelter to read to our adoptable cats, dogs, and even small animals. This program has been a big hit with parents and children, and our animals certainly like the attention. A Tale for Two takes place every Monday, and you can register your child at vbspca.com/a-tale-for-two.

Home For The Holidays

The 12th annual Home for the Holidays promotion was a huge success! Priority Automotive led the effort to help homeless animals find their way into a loving home during the holiday season. Priority Toyota Chespeake teamed up with the VBSPCA and two other local animal shelters and paid 50% of all canine and feline adoption fees. The program kicked off December 5th and was slated to run through the end of the year or until funds ran out, whichever came first.

By December 22, all funds were used and a total of 304 animals were adopted from participating Southside shelters! Here at the VBSPCA alone, 130 animals found forever homes during this annual adoption promotion. Congratulations to our new pet parents, and a special thank you to Priority Automotive for making second chances possible for so many animals!

Bella Adopted December 2020

At 3 years old, Bella has had quite a journey. She came to the VBSPCA last July through our transfer partners in St. Charles Parrish, Louisiana. When they found her, she was missing a paw, heartworm positive, and abandoned.

Once Bella arrived at the VBSPCA, our veterinarians determined that she would need to have her back, right leg amputated in addition to treatment for advanced heartworm disease. Bella was placed in a foster home while she went through her treatment and recovered from surgery, and she was finally cleared for adoption in October. I found Bella on the VBSPCA website. I wasn't really planning on adopting another dog but something told me that she was going to be hard to resist and I was right. Bella is doing awesome, fitting in well with the routine and her two dog sisters, Peanut and Penny. They are both younger than Bella - but she has equal, if not more, energy and enthusiasm.

Bella enjoys running outside in the backyard, digging for grubs, chasing her sisters, and has also learned that naps are great! She does not like to get in her kennel for bedtime - she will run on the couch and curl up into a ball, like "you can't see me" - it's the cutest thing.

I would encourage anyone who may be looking to adopt a dog with special needs-go for it. It's such a blessing and you will feel great with all the love that dog will give back to you. I look into Bella's eyes and I see how grateful she is. She gives me lots of kisses daily too to thank me for giving a three-legged dog a chance - a chance to prove that she's just as awesome as any four-legged dog.



Ginny & Wanda Adopted July 2020

We had just returned two fosters to the VBSPCA when the staff asked us if we would take home Ginny and Wanda for their two week vaccine quarantine. Typically our fosters go into a separate room for their stay as they are usually younger, but both kittens refused to be separated from our family. We tempted fate and allowed them to begin to roam the house. Our last cat to be adopted, Galen, is an extremely shy cat and hesitant to accept new animals. He was never scared when we brought them home and introduced them. Once their personalities began to shine, it was clear that Ginny and Wanda were choosing us. It would have broken our hearts to separate the girls, so we decided to make both of them permanent members of our family.
