

You Can Prevent Pet Poisoning

An important part of having a pet is making sure you keep them happy and healthy.

You probably already know that you have to put your toys away so your pet won't chew them or eat parts of them. But there are other things in your home that can be very dangerous to pets if they swallow them - that includes some of the foods you eat!

You can help prevent pet poisoning by keeping your pet away from these items:



Dangerous Foods

Some foods that you love to eat can make your pet very sick. Some of the most common foods that are poisonous to pets are **chocolate**, **gum**, **grapes**, **raisins**, **and avocado**.



Medicine

Make sure **all medicine** is kept away from your pets, whether it is for pets or people. If you drop your medicine and your pet eats it, make sure you tell an adult right away.



Other Items Around the Home

Things like **batteries**, **homemade play dough**, **detergent**, **and dryer sheets** are also poisonous to pets. Plants like **azalea**, **lilies**, **and yew** can also make your pet very sick.

A good rule of thumb is to tell an adult if your pet has gotten a hold of anything that is not theirs. By paying attention to what your pet is doing, you can help keep your pet safe!

Respect Your Pet:

What They're Trying To Tell You

Cats, dogs, and even small animals have their own language and way they communicate their emotions and needs. Pets communicate through sounds, body language, and behaviors. It is important that we learn their language so we can respect their feelings. Respect is the key to any healthy relationship, especially those with our furry friends!

Sounds - Dogs bark and cats meow in an effort to get your attention. They might be hungry or ready to play, or it might be time for a bathroom break. When a bark or meow turns into a growl or a hiss, your pet is unhappy and needs some space.

Tail Wagging - Your pet's tail can tell you all kinds of things. If a cat's tail is high and tall, they are feeling curious. If it is wagging from side to side, your cat is feeling agitated. If it is puffy, your cat is experiencing fear. If your dog's tail is wagging loosely from side to side, the dog is feeling friendly. If his tail is between his legs, he is feeling scared. If your pup's tail is pointing the and wagging quickly he is feeling threatened and many

up and wagging quickly, he is feeling threatened and may need a break.

Ears and Eyes - When your cat lays back his ears and widens his eyes, he is ready for a hunt. When cats blink, it is a sign that they are comfortable around you. If a cat's or dog's eyes get very big, they are feeling afraid or upset. Dog's ears are also good indicators of how they are feeling. If they are up, your dog is listening to something. If his ears are flattened, he is feeling scared.

Running Away, Cowering, or Hiding - If your pet is doing any of these things, he wants to be left alone. Be sure to give him space!

By listening to what your pet is trying to say, you'll become even better friends!
