### The Importance of Foster Homes

The Virginia Beach SPCA has some very special volunteers that we call fosters. Fosters are people who allow a shelter animal to stay in their home for a while before the pet can find their forever home.

Some animals go into foster homes because they are not yet ready to be adopted. Young puppies and kittens need to grow bigger and stronger before they can be adopted, so foster families provide them with additional care. Other animals stay in foster homes because they are sick or injured and need a quiet place to recover. Fosters even give some of our animals a break if they become too overwhelmed or stressed at the shelter!

Fosters not only help the animals in their homes, they help other homeless animals too! When an animal goes into a foster home, that creates a space at the VBSPCA Shelter for another pet who doesn't have any place to go.

Fostering can make you feel good since you are helping animals, but it can also be hard to say goodbye when it is time for the pets to return to the shelter. However, fosters are very important for animal shelters like the VBSPCA since they provide special attention and care for animals who need a little extra support before they find their forever homes.
