Letter From Derby Brackett



The tempo of the past 6 months is a joyous change to the cautious nature of the past 2 years. While still careful to protect the safety and health of those around us, we have been able to gather together to celebrate the connection between people and their pets once again. The attendance and vitality at our gala in April was a clear indication that people are ready to get out and support their favorite causes. I think we all had a great time together under the twilight stars

at New Realm. I am grateful that so many generous souls have remained loyal to the animals under such challenging circumstances. We continue to find support through so many channelsdonors, volunteers, members, our partners in animal welfare, and our supporters in the community. Our mission is sustained by these caring individuals and allows us to continue to focus on our vision of quality care for all of the animals that come to the VBSPCA.

As we turn our attention to the next 6 months, we find our shelter - like so many in our region- full of animals in need of homes. There are many circumstances causing this increase in population, primarily pets being surrendered combined with the very busy season of kittens and puppies. We are indebted to our foster network for helping us find viable solutions for our youngest animals, and we are grateful to our staff for working hard for our animals, whether providing resources to keep them with their owners or finding the best forever home with a new adopter. It has been a very busy time for all in animal welfare this spring, and we don't anticipate any slow down for the immediate future. We will continue to dedicate ourselves to managing and caring for a very heavy population of deserving companions.

Our clinic has been busier than ever. Vaccine clinics, spay/neuter surgeries, and general illness visits have been compounded by more urgent cases as the lack of accessible veterinary care has increased. Veterinary clinics are stretched thin with staffing shortages while the number of animals in need seems to be growing. Our staff has adapted to provide public pets with additional services like emergency surgeries and laser treatments whenever possible while still caring for our many shelter animals. The VBSPCA clinic and Neuter Scooter will continue to be fully operational, providing quality veterinary care to our community in need.

We are at the beginning stages of planning for our next 3-year strategic plan to take us through to 2026. If I have learned anything over the past 2 years, it is that our mission of

compassion is desperately needed in our community and that our business model to sustain that vision must be agile, adapting to the circumstances presented to us. We must balance the compassion of animal sheltering with resources needed for the community- accessible veterinary care, behavioral support for animals in the home, humane education for the children, and connections for people and their pets. Our strategic plan will center on fiscal stability at the core while exploring areas for real growth in clinic services and expanded animal care. We will focus on our partnerships in animal welfare to create collaborative solutions for all of the animals in our region. We will build on our community connections through redesigning our humane education program; offering more volunteer opportunities in multiple areas; providing enrichment paths for our animals, whether through our Beach Buddies or Visiting Paws programs; holding events such as our Puttin' for Paws golf tournament on October 7th to engage our fellow animal lovers (and golfers!)- all targeted to creating lasting relationships with our stakeholders: adopters, pet owners, donors, members, and volunteers.

The momentum of the past months has created new energy, and we want to capture and build on the positive outcomes; facing the new day with open-mindedness, hope, commitment, and the resilience that has carried us successfully through the past 2 years.

The animals of our community deserve the very best and our intention is to be there when they need us. And they always need us...

SURRENDERING YOUR PET

When You're Forced To Say Goodbye

It's a choice pet parents never want to face: whether to keep their pet or take measures to find them a new home. This decision can come up for a variety of reasons. A family may be moving and unable to take their furry friend with them. Their pet may not be getting along with other members of the household. The previous owner may have passed away and their family members can't keep their beloved pet.

No matter the reason, the VBSPCA understands that life can throw you curveballs. Part of our mission is to be there for the pets that need someplace to go. While we aim to create lasting adoptions and try to provide solutions to keep as many animals in homes as possible, sometimes there is no other option than to surrender your pet to a shelter.

In 2021, 861 pets were surrendered to the VBSPCA. That's roughly 33% of the animals that came through our shelter last year. The decision to surrender a pet is never easy, but our team lets each and every pet parent know that we will provide compassionate care for their animal until they find a new home.



Tristyn, a nine year old Australian Terrier mix, arrived at our shelter in May because he was not getting along with young children in his previous home. Our kennel team introduced him to some of the smaller dogs in our care, and he enjoyed having canine roommates while he waited for his forever home. After a month in our care, Tristyn was happily adopted.

FOSTERING SAVES LIVES



Providing Specialized Care to Vulnerable Animals

Fosters are a critical part of our mission. These dedicated volunteers open their homes to animals in need of specialized care before they are ready for the adoption process. Many of the animals who need time in foster homes are young puppies and kittens.

While there is a lot of work that goes into these vulnerable animals, our fosters agree this labor of love is worth it. "It's hard to choose one favorite thing about fostering," says Mallory Bashaw, who has fostered 14 VBSPCA puppies since October 2020. "I love watching them learn how to puppy."

Jayson Schwantes has been fostering felines since 2015, 67 in total. He often takes on special cases of mother cats along with their litters. "We like fostering the moms with babies because we know there's a need; not everyone wants a 10-12 week commitment," Schwantes explains. "We really get to know them having them that long... and we like seeing them develop from being little, blind, and helpless into independent kittens."

The VBSPCA provides our fosters with everything they need to care for their houseguests. Another perk of fostering is unlimited kisses, wags, and purrs.

Both Schwantes and Bashaw have also adopted one of their temporary guests. Schwantes was especially attached to a litter of seven. One feline, Ella, bonded with him and is now a permanent member of the family. Bashaw has adopted two of her former foster puppies: Blue and Stevie.

Collaboration

Working Together for the Animals

Bella came from a life of neglect. She had been kept outside with three other small dogs until her owners turned her and her canine companions over to PETA. Bella was transported directly to the VBSPCA where our team was ready to help. She arrived filthy and severely matted, but that didn't prevent her from sharing affection with everyone she met. Our team shaved Bella's mats and gave her a bath before settling her into a kennel. Within days, she was adopted into a loving home. A journey from neglect to a loving home was only possible because of collaboration.

Bella's tale is just one of many successful stories that were made possible thanks to our transfer relationships. The VBSPCA actively partners with other animal shelters and rescues across the region and beyond in an effort to provide collaborative resources to animals in need. Sometimes animals are brought to us due to a lack of space at another shelter. On other occasions we take in animals in need of medical care that we are able to provide through our veterinary clinic and Miracle Medical Fund. Some animals arrive here simply because they have a better chance of being adopted due to the 3000 visitors who come to the shelter each. In situations when an animal is not thriving in the shelter environment, we rely on rescue partners who can provide focused care until the animal is adopted. Whatever the reason, the many challenges that homeless animals face cannot be solved by one team alone.

The need for collaboration among shelter partners will always exist. While our philosophies and programs may differ, our shared focus on helping homeless animals is strong and united. The current homeless animal crisis has shelters across the country at capacity, each one taking a creative approach to finding and making space for animals so that euthaniasia can be avoided whenever possible. The need for collaboration is relevant now more than ever, and the VBSPCA is focusing transfer efforts on our local partners to help alleviate the current crisis here in Hampton Roads. In May, over 75% of the animals transferred to the VBSPCA were from our local shelter partners. Marco and Hiccup, on the next page, are two success stories made possible by our local transfer relationships.

This crisis is not going anywhere anytime soon, so we ask and encourage our community members to support the VBSPCA and our local shelter partners through adoptions and donations. We need your help to overcome what lies ahead. Marco's Adoption Day

Marco

Marco came to the VBSPCA from our friends at Chesapeake Animal Services in February when they had reached capacity and needed help. Marco had severe skin allergies that had led to hair loss and extremely itchy skin. The VBSPCA clinic team gave him allergy medication and put him on a special diet. He became a favorite among our cattery team, who made sure he received enrichment and affection while in our care. Three months after coming through our doors, Marco found his forever family.

Hiccup

The Peninsula Regional Animal Shelter brought Hiccup to us in April. His history was heartbreaking, as he had chewed off his own foot. It appeared that a tether was wound around his leg, preventing movement and causing pain. Despite these tragic circumstances, Hiccup arrived at our shelter with his tail wagging and full of affection. Hiccup was rushed to our clinic, where our team quickly cleaned the wound and made him comfortable for the night. His leg was amputated the following day, after which point he spent time in a foster home to recover. One month later, Hiccup was happily adopted.

Adopted December 2021

Arlo came to the VBSPCA in December 2021. His previous owners had moved and no longer had space for him to run and play, so they made the difficult decision to surrender him to the VBSPCA. Within a couple of days, the two year old Basset Hound caught the eye of a couple who had taken a day off to visit a few local shelters in hopes of adopting a dog. "After a minute [inside the visiting room], Arlo was happily getting rubs and checking us out," says Ali. "Bassets in general are hard to resist!"

Once they met Arlo, Ali and her husband, Steve, knew he was the one. While Arlo was a little unsure the first few nights, he successfully settled in with a little reassurance. He's especially happy to have a large backyard to explore. Now Arlo goes just about everywhere with his pet parents, including regular visits to the farmers market.

"It's truly like Arlo has been with us his whole life," says Ali. "He just fit right into our routines and loves to be right next to us wherever we go."
