

The Great Indoors

This is a great time of year to get outside and enjoy some fun in the sun. While your cat may be curious about the world outside the window, it's important to keep your feline friends

indoors.

There are a lot of reasons why cats should stay inside your home. It is important to make sure cats get the exercise and enrichment they need inside! Here are some ideas to keep your kitty happy and healthy:




Put a cat tree next to a window so they can watch birds and see what's going on outside.

Ask an adult to get some cat grass and put it inside a room your cat spends time in regularly.

Make sure your cat has plenty of opportunities to play. Some great options include feather wands, laser pointers, and other toys. Cat scratchers are also very fun for felines!

Respect Your Pup

Just like people, dogs have a language to tell you how they are feeling. Instead of words, animals use their body language and behavior to let you know if they are ready to play, want some time alone, or are afraid of something or someone.

You can be a good friend to your pup by learning what they are trying to tell you. When you pay close attention to what they are trying to communicate and show them respect, your pet will learn to trust you. It also protects you since dogs give warning signs before they may bite or snap.







If a Dog is Threatened

The dog will try to make themself look bigger by raising the fur on their back and/or tail; raising their ears upward and forward; or sticking their tail straight up

They may be very still and stare at what is bothering them

They may growl, lunge or bark

If a Dog is Afraid

The dog will try to make themself look smaller by cowering, lowering their head, tucking their tail, or flattening their ears

They may lick their lips a lot, yawn a lot, or avoid eye contact


They may growl or snarl

If a Dog is Playful

The dog is wagging their tail loosely from side to side or in a circle

They may "play bow," or lean down on their front end and leave their back end in the air

They are acting silly and bouncing around





You should always leave your pup alone if they are eating, sleeping, sick, or hurt. If your dog walks away from you or tries to hide from you, let them be.

Always remember:

You should **never** go up to a dog or try to touch a dog you don't know without an adult telling you it is okay to do so.

Complete reading activities to earn prizes


